Housekeeping program

What is ecological cleaning? Ecological cleaning, or green cleaning, refers to the use of cleaning products that do not emit any pollutants during their use. Their use is essential to ensure the health of individuals and respect for the environment.

Our program includes the purchase of bulk products to refill our cleaner containers, the use of energy-efficient equipment, the use of a service frequency grid and specific target point adapted to the seasons to better prevent the spread of viruses when they are more active as well as best practices in residual materials management (compost, recycling and waste)

There are two public electric vehicle charging stations at parking lot S2, operated by Flo. With the surge toward electric vehicles, demand for these stations has increased, but so have complaints that some people leave their cars "charging" at the station longer than necessary. We ask that you be courteous to your fellow electric vehicle owners, who also need charging, by unplugging your vehicle from the charging station and removing it from parking spaces reserved for this purpose, as soon as your charge is finished. We have a plan to add 10 additional new terminals in the near future to better meet demand.
